

Fort Hunter Liggett 2010 Military Deer Hunt Tag Drawing

Eligibility Requirements and Application Procedures

Application Deadline is 4:30 pm on June 2, 2010

(Successful hunters will be notified by June 30, 2010)

For the 2010/2011 hunting season, an applicant priority system will be used for the Military Deer Hunt Tag Drawing based on Army Regulation 215-1 (Table 7-1)*. Eligibility criteria and priority of use are:

1	Active duty (AD) military personnel and Families (includes U.S. Coast Guard)
2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Members of the Reserve Component and Families (includes Ready Reserve (to include Scholarship/Contract ROTC Cadets) and National Guard, and their Family members)Delayed Entry/Delayed Training recruitsCadets of Armed Forces academies (USMA cadets have first priority at USMA)
3	Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service and Commissioned Corps of National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and their Family members
4	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Retired military personnel from active duty and Family membersRetired from the Reserves with pay and retired without pay

* There are 19 priority categories; however it is likely that all tags in some hunt codes will be awarded to priority code 1 applicants and all tags in other hunt codes will be awarded by priority code 2-4 applicants.

Proof of Eligibility: Each eligible applicant must have a 2010/11 California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG) hunting license, a valid and appropriate federal U.S. government issued document(s) demonstrating eligibility to one of the four priority codes to include but not limited to: Department of Defense (DoD) Common Access Card (CAC), U.S. Identification and Privilege Dependand Card or U.S. Uniformed Services Retired Military Identification Card.

Deer Application Process: Do Not send CDFG deer applications or tags until notified. Complete and submit: (1) a 2010 FHL Military deer Tag Drawing Application with (2) a photocopy (both sides) of your valid DoD CAC or appropriate U.S. government issued document(s), and (3) a copy of your 2010/2011 California hunting license. Apprentice applicants must be a dependand of one of the four priority categories, have a 2010/11 CDFG Junior hunting license, and submit their own and their legal guardian's eligibility document. Social Security Numbers are not required on any document and can be removed, if desired.

Each eligible hunter may submit two deer draw applications, but only one application per special hunt. Two eligible individuals may apply as a party.

To receive a military special deer hunt tag, successful applicants will be required to submit for exchange either: (1) a DFG First-Deer Tag Application, (2) a DFG Second-Deer Tag Application, (3) a DFG "2010 Deer Tag Drawing Notice" or (4) a DFG A, B, C or D Deer Zone tag if the earliest season (either archery or general) for the tag has not yet opened.

New for 2010

Preference Point System was established with the 2009 Draw. This system allows applicants to apply each year regardless of previous year's success in the draw. One preference point will be awarded to applicants who were entered into the FHL draw but were unsuccessful in drawing their requested FHL tag in the previous year.
