




# COMBAT SUPPORT TRAINING CENTER

## 2007 Executive Summary

Established October 2005, the U.S. Army Combat Support Training Center (CSTC) provides ranges, training areas and facilities to Active and Reserve units of all branches of the military. The CSTC also supports training conducted by government agencies at the federal, state and local levels. The California-based CSTC's primary mission is to support Army Reserve training for the Western United States.


The California-based CSTC encompasses four unique, diverse, and geographically dispersed Army installations located in northern and central California. Headquartered at Fort Hunter Liggett in South Monterey County, the CSTC oversees the base operations, training facilities, and housing assets of Fort Hunter Liggett and Camp Parks in Dublin. It also provides military housing at Moffett Field in Mountain View, and lodging and dining facilities at the B.T. Collins Army Reserve Center in Sacramento.

# VALUE TO THE ARMY & THE DEPT. OF DEFENSE

- ◆ Fort Hunter Liggett is one of only two Department of Defense installations with Mediterranean terrain and has extensive range facilities, including a tank gunnery range and a 6,000 foot assault air strip.
- ◆ Fort Hunter Liggett is designated as a Power Support Platform (PSP) to support mobilization activities.
- ◆ Camp Parks is strategically located to service more than 20,000 Soldiers and provides the only automated weapons qualification ranges in the San Francisco and East Bay Area.
- ◆ Camp Parks and the Army Complex at Moffett Field provides much needed military housing for the San Francisco and East Bay Area.
